Homework (Webassign): Homework will be conducted via weekly assignments on WebAssign. You must buy the bundled WebAssign when you purchase the textbook. There will be no extensions given for the WebAssign assignments.

Labs: There will be 6 Lab assignments, made of problems about some of the concepts presented in class. You will need to use a programming language to solve the problems in the lab, and turn in your answers. I will communicate the deadlines while we go about the semester.
